

## Background Information/Project Overview

The Scott County Mission is “To advance safe, healthy and livable communities through citizen-focused services.” Scott County is the road authority responsible for County Highway (CH) 17 (Marshall Road).

### Proposed Project:

In 2015, Scott County is proposing improvements to the segment of CH 17 between CH 42 and Dominion Avenue in the City of Shakopee. The proposed project will reconstruct CH 17 from a two-lane rural roadway to four-lane divided urban roadway including storm-water quality treatment systems, bicycle/pedestrian trails and bus shoulders. The proposed project will improve the safety and capacity of this important north-south arterial highway by:

- ◆ Reducing access points with the closure of Chateau Avenue and Blue Heron Trail and some driveway accesses along CH 17. Any remaining private driveway accesses will be converted to right-in, right-out.
- ◆ Improving the Wood Duck Trail intersection by adding turn-lanes.
- ◆ Adding capacity to serve existing traffic and expected growth.

### Background/Corridor Study:

The 2015 CH 17 project is in between two projects:

- ◆ To the south, in 2011, a partial interchange at CH 17 /42 was completed.
- ◆ To the north, CH 17 is part of a project currently under construction from Dominion Avenue to CH 16. This project will reconstruct CH 17 a four-lane roadway.

Traffic volumes have increased and are projected to continue to increase on the CH 17 corridor. As a result, CH 17 is reaching its traffic capacity limit. In order to manage existing and future growth and traffic in the corridor, it is critical to develop a safe and efficient transportation system that balances mobility and property access. As part of this effort, Scott County partnered with the cities of Shakopee and Prior Lake, and Cedar Lake and Spring Lake Townships, and Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT), to study CH 17 and State Highway 13 in order to plan for future needs of this important north-south minor arterial corridor. This study, published in 2009, identified a number of roadway improvements needed to correct safety problems, accommodate growing traffic

levels, and guide the future of these important regional roadways.

During the corridor study process residents, business owners, and other interested parties were involved in three open houses held in 2007 and 2008. In addition, several neighborhood meetings were held to identify options for coordinating access changes along the corridor. The corridor study, approved by all study partners, recommended a four-lane urban roadway to be constructed along this segment of CH 17.
