Primary Prevention Strategies



## General Education and Information

- Social media and marketing
- Media campaigns to prevent opioid misuse
- Parent education regarding signs and symptoms of use
- Community presentations in English and Spanish



## Evidence-based programs in schools

- Courage to Speak (CNTU)
- MADD
- SADD
- Chemical Health Specialists
- Mental Health Center school-based programs
- Partnership with Know the Truth Prevention Program



## Reduced access

- Public education related to safe drug disposal
- Take it to the Box
- Distribution of Detera bags
- Lock it up! Billboard
- Parent education on reducing home/social access to opioids via schools, website, community events



## Community efforts

- Engaging non-profits and faith community in prevention activities
- Youth-focused programs with demonstrated effectiveness
- Provide SUD information via Scott County Prevention Coalition
- Supports positive youth development and family conversations via Talk Tins (conversation starters for families)
- Working with the CAPS programs to provide education and awareness within the schools



## Prescribing practices

- Provider education
- Prescription monitoring program
- Non-opioid treatment alternatives and integrated therapies
- Educating dispensers on appropriate opioid dispensing

- Make it Okay
- Change to Chill

## Harm reduction

- Medicated Assisted Therapy
- Training and education about naloxone
- Distribution of naloxone kits in the community
- Training and education for first responders



## Early identification and treatment

- Scott County Crisis Response (Canvas Health) for mental health
- Hospital-based outpatient treatment
- CCHBC Certification in progress
- Scott County Mental Health Center
- Coordinated response with law enforcement
- Peer recovery coach at Family Resource Center



## Supporting justice involved individuals and individuals in recovery

- Social Worker in the Jail - screening and connection to resources
- Treatment Court & Veteran's Court
- Public Health Nurse embedded in Treatment Court
- Moms on a Mission to Success (MOMs Group)
- Distribution of naloxone and fentanyl strips upon release (pilot)
- Recovery support for perinatal population through home visiting
